

Methodist Richardson Medical Center Fact Sheet



Overview

Methodist Richardson Medical Center has offered compassionate medical, surgical and behavioral health services to the surrounding community for more than 30 years. Our mission is to improve the quality of life through exceptional health care services for the people we serve.

The medical center was established in 1966 after the Richardson City Council formed the Richardson Hospital Authority. That same year, the Hospital Authority purchased Richardson General Hospital and transformed the 35-bed, for-profit hospital into the first not-for-profit hospital serving the City of Richardson. The hospital joined Methodist Health System in June 2009 and changed its name from Richardson Regional Medical Center to Methodist Richardson Medical Center. Today, Methodist Richardson has two campuses to serve the community.

Campbell Campus

The primary campus includes the main hospital and two medical plazas. In addition, the Methodist Richardson Health Center and Medical Plaza III are conveniently located within a three-mile radius of the Campbell Campus. The main hospital – a 205-bed acute care facility – is staffed by physicians in over 35 different specialties. Medical specialties include primary care, neurosurgery, orthopedics, cardiology and much more.

Bush/Renner Campus

The Methodist Richardson complex located at E. President George Bush Turnpike and Renner Road is designed to serve the fast-growing communities of Wylie, Sachse, Murphy and surrounding areas. The campus is home to a five-story physician pavilion with more than 20 physicians in a full range of specialties. The campus also includes the Methodist Richardson Cancer Center, affiliated with UT Southwestern Medical Center, and an outpatient hospital with a full service emergency department, a lab and medical imaging services.
